The Seven Swans

Chinese artist draws Faroese stamps

The long-standing collaboration between Posta Stamps and the artist and engraver Martin Mörck played a substantial part in us being introduced to the renowned Chinese artist Li Yunzhong from Huhot, Inner Mongolia, at a Philatelic Exhibition in China.

Martin Mörck recommended that we collaborate with Mr. Yunzhong due to the fact that he is one of the young gifted representatives of traditional Chinese painting. Li Yunzhong has designed stamps for both China and the UN and he accepted our offer to design a stamp for the Faroe Islands with great enthusiasm.

During the last six years, Posta has been very active in taking part in philatelic exhibitions in China and we have placed great emphasis on reaching out to Chinese collectors by creating a web store in Chinese. The most important thing, however, about the present


philatelic venture is the fact that the subject is purely Faroese. The old Faroese adventure, "The Seven Swans", which was chosen as a stamp motif, is a part of Jakob Jakobsen's famed fairy tale collection "FAROESE FOLK TALES AND LEGENDS" dating back to 1901.

The present stamp issue is a joint collaboration project between the engraver Martin Mörck, who engraved the stamp, and Li Yunzhong, who designed it.
